Year 13 Biology Field Studies

At the beginning of term, Year 13 Biologists went on a Biology field course to Juniper Hall, near Box Hill. The students studied how nail varnish can be used to estimate the population of pond snails, the effect of water velocity on the abundance of freshwater shrimps, and how centuries of coppicing have created changes in plant diversity on the floor of woodland. In between times, Longworth traps were set to capture live mammals with some success, and they found rare palmate newts, as well as the nymphs of the hawker dragonfly and the beautiful demoiselle. As a residential trip - the first of the year - it was delightful to have the extended time studying ecology as part of A Level Biology.

This term, Year 11 undertook a kidney and heart dissection.










Jack the Ripper Tour

They were researching interesting questions such as 'How does radial velocity affect g-force?'. The group went on Tidal Wave together at the end of the day and came home very soggy!



Geography Field Trip to Dorset

After two 'unprecedented' years, it was a delight to be able to take the Year 12 Geographers on a three day residential trip to Leeson House in Dorset. The group spent an enjoyable day in Swanage gathering data to measure the impact coastal defences had on the beach profile, with everyone taking a turn in getting to grips with how to use the equipment. It is always beneficial to experience the case study locations in person and the group were lucky enough to visit both the concordant and discordant stretch of the Jurassic Coastline.

The contrasting urban area saw students investigating the sustainable settlement of Poundbury built on Duchy of Cornwall land. This was based on Prince Charles' vision of how a settlement could provide a mix of private and affordable housing, alongside jobs within walking distance. This provided a useful link to the Diverse Places unit and will give students a useful place to start with the NEA in the summer.

The last site was the stunning Durdle Door and Man O'War Bay, where students could witness how tectonic uplift and marine processes have shaped some of the most spectacular scenery along the Jurassic Coast. Students were able to capture the moment and articulate their understanding in a series of unique TikToks for Gores Tours.

The purpose of the trip was to allow the students to experience fieldwork in preparation for their skills exam in the summer. Fieldwork remains an integral part of all geography education, and there is no substitute for learning directly about the untidy real world outside the dassroom. Our thanks to go to the Leeson House staff, for their warm welcome and constant good humour and Mr Moore for stepping in at the last minute to allow the trip to continue.



Year 8 visit Kew Gardens

The Geography and Biology departments once again joined forces to take Year 8 to Kew Gardens to investigate how plants have adapted in different biomes. Students were able to experience the humidity of the Palm House and observe the distinctive layers found in tropical rainforests. With climate uncertainty very much in the news, the focus was on how climate change will affect plants at different latitudes.



MFL Activities

This term there have been many activities for students to take part in including learning about Halloween in Spanish and further to the University of Southampton's MFL "El Dia de los Muertos" event, Year 8 students learnt about "El Dia de los Muertos" (The Day of the Dead), a big tradition of The Feast of All Saints and Halloween in Mexico. This gave students an insight into understanding other Spanish speaking cultures and the students enjoyed activities including designing their own festival skulls/masks. Students have also enjoyed Japanese lessons, including how to introduce themselves, numbers and the etiquette of bowing. At the end of term, students enjoyed making Gingerbread Houses at German Club.



ISA National Finalist


The College was delighted to announce that it was a finalist in the ISA Award for Outstanding Sport (Large School).
